Residency or Address Requirement	Mailing address required; unsheltered residents can register by using descriptive location where one usually resides (ex: street corner, park, shelter, etc.). If no residence address, must complete the following form: <a href="https://azsos.gov/media/235">https://azsos.gov/media/235</a>
ID requirement	Arizona Driver's License/Identification Number, Indian Census Number, Bureau of Indian Affairs Card Number, Tribal Treaty Card Number, or fill in your Tribal Enrollment Number in Box 10 on the voter registration form. A photocopy of your U.S. naturalization documents or fill in your Alien Registration Number in Box 11 on the voter registration form. A legible photocopy of your birth certificate and supporting legal documentation (i.e., marriage certificate) if the name on the birth certificate is not the same as your current legal name. Photocopy of the pertinent pages of your U.S. passport. Photocopy of your Tribal Certificate of Indian Blood or Bureau of Indian Affairs Affidavit of Birth.

In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	When you arrive to vote at the polls on Election Day you will announce your name and place of residence to the election official and present one form of identification from List #1 or two different forms of identification from List #2 or 3. Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline: October 26th, 2024	Voters can register at any time for the Active Early Voting List (AEVL) via Online Registration ( <a href="https://servicearizona.com/VoterRegistration/selectLanguage">https://servicearizona.com/VoterRegistration/selectLanguage</a> ). In order to ensure the voter receives a ballot in time, registration for AEVL must be submitted 11 days before the general election. Voters can also apply to receive a one-time mail-in ballot via Online Registration, by calling their County Recorder ( <a href="https://azsos.gov/elections/about-elections/county-election-officials-contact-information">https://azsos.gov/elections/about-elections/county-election-officials-contact-information</a> ), or by mailing in the ballot-by-mail request form ( <a href="https://azsos.gov/media/136">https://azsos.gov/media/136</a> ).
