Residency or Address Requirement	For homeless individuals, residential address of a "location one regularly returns to" and mailing address (to receive mailed ballot and other correspondence but does not need to match residence and can be a PO box.)
ID requirement	Photo ID (specifics: Does not require voters to present photo identification. However, some voters may be asked to show a form of identification when voting if they are voting for the first time after registering to vote by mail and did not provide a driver license number, California identification number, or the last four digits of their social security number. Photo ID OR official document with voter's name and address are acceptable for voting. Can register online without ID OR official document such as utility bill government check, or pay check with voter's name and address.

In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	When voting at the polls in Colorado, you are required to provide identification. Accepted forms of ID include a driver's license, state ID card, U.S. passport, or a utility bill. (Colorado Revised Statutes § 1-7.5-107).
Absentee or Mail-in Voting	All registered voters in Colorado are automatically mailed a ballot, which must be returned by 7:00 PM on Election Day. If you do not receive your mail-in ballot or need a replacement, you can request one through the Secretary of State's website or contact your County Clerk's Office.
