Residency or Address Requirement	Need to list address for receiving mail, but can be a shelter /post office, etc
ID requirement	Photo Identification is not required. For most voters, your identification must fit one of the following requirements for it to be accepted as a valid form of ID at the polls: name and address, or name and signature, or name and photograph. However, for voters who are voting for the first time, and lacked proper identification when registering, some additional types of identification may be required.

Mail-in Registration Deadline	Postmarked by Monday, October 18, 2024
Online Registration Deadline	Monday, October 18, 2024

<p>In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024</p>	<p>When you arrive at the polls on Election Day in Connecticut, you do not need to show ID unless it is your first time voting in a federal election. First-time voters who did not include identification when they registered may be required to show a driver's license, utility bill, or another form of acceptable ID.</p>
<p>Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline: October 18th, 2024</p>	<p>Connecticut voters can request an absentee ballot up to 7 days before Election Day. You must meet certain eligibility criteria, such as being out of town, illness, or religious observance, to qualify for absentee voting. Visit the Connecticut Secretary of the State's website or contact your local Town Clerk's office to request or confirm your absentee ballot details.</p>
<p>Early Voting</p>	<p>For the first time in Connecticut, early voting will be available starting with the 2024 election. Early voting will begin 14 days before Election Day and end 4 days before Election Day. Voters can cast their ballots at designated early voting locations during this period. You can check with your local election office for more information on early voting locations and hours.</p>
