Residency or Address Requirement	You may indicate P.O. Box or alternate mail service mail service option, including general delivery, as your mailing address on the application.

In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	When you vote in person on Election Day in Hawaii, you generally do not need to show identification unless you are a first-time voter in a federal election. First-time voters may need to provide ID if it wasn't submitted during registration. Acceptable forms of ID include a Hawaii driver's license, state ID card, or a utility bill.
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline: Received by October 28, 2024	Hawaii voters can request a mail-in ballot up to 7 days before Election Day. All registered voters in Hawaii are automatically mailed a ballot, but voters can request a replacement or confirm their mailing address via the Office of Elections website or by contacting their County Elections Division.
Early Voting	Hawaii offers early voting beginning at least 10 days before the election and ending 3 days before Election Day. The state may offer additional early voting days leading up to Election Day. You can check specific early voting locations and dates through the Hawaii Office of Elections website.
