Residency or Address Requirement	Mailing address required
ID requirement	Driver's license or ID card issued by Kansas or another state, U.S. Passport, U.S. Military ID, ID card issued by a Native American tribe, Employee badge or ID issued by a government office, Student ID card from an accredited postsecondary education institution in Kansas, Concealed carry license issued by Kansas or another state, or Public assistance ID card issued by a government office. Exemptions from photo ID requirements exist for: permanent advance voters (voters with illness or disabilities); military and overseas voters and their spouses and dependents; and voter with religious objections who sign a Declaration of Religious Objection (Form DRO). Voters age 65 or older may use an expired photo ID.

Mail-in Registration Deadline	Postmarked by Tuesday October 15, 2024
Online Registration Deadline	Tuesday October 15, 2024

Voter Assistance or Accessibility	Kansas is committed to ensuring that every voter can cast their ballot privately and independently. Accessibility options include curbside voting, mail-in ballots, and voting assistance at polling places. Voters with disabilities can also request help from a friend or family member or utilize special equipment at polling locations. In-Person Voting: Tuesday, October 15, 2024	When you arrive to vote at the polls in Kansas, you will be required to show a valid photo ID. Acceptable forms of identification include a driver's license, state ID card, U.S. passport, or military ID. First-time voters who did not provide ID at registration may be required to provide additional documentation, such as a utility bill, bank statement, or government document with your name and address. For a full list of acceptable IDs, visit the Kansas Secretary of State's website.
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline	October 29, 2024: Kansas voters must request a mail-in ballot no later than 7 days before Election Day. Any registered voter can request a mail-in ballot, but requests must be made to your County Election Office. Mail-in ballots must be returned by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, or they can be postmarked by Election Day and received by Friday, November 8, 2024.
Early Voting	In Kansas, early voting starts as early as 20 days before the election and continues until the day before Election Day. The specific dates and locations for early voting vary by county, so voters should contact their County Election Office for more information.
