ID requirement	Photo ID is requested. If ID is not presented, the voter signs an affidavit and votes on a regular ballot.	
If there are 15+ days before an election, voters can register online, by mail, or in person. Within 14 days of an election, and on Election Day, voters may only register by visiting their local clerk's office to register in person with proof of residency documentation.

In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	Unregistered voters, or voters who have not updated their registration to their current address, must go to their local clerk's office to register and may also vote at their clerk's office using an absentee ballot.
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline: Received by November 5, 2024	Absentee ballots must be received by a voter's local clerk's office by 8 p.m. on Election Day to be counted, with the exception of military and overseas ballots which must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by their local clerk within 6 days after the election in order to be counted.
Early Voting	The early voting period takes place for a minimum of nine consecutive days, ending on the Sunday before an election. Communities may decide to provide additional days of early voting, up to 29 days total. Early voting site locations, dates, and hours are available 60 days prior to Election Day at <u>Michigan.gov/Vote</u> .
