ID requirement	Mississippi voters are required to present photo identification in order to vote in person. Accepted forms include a driver's license, U.S. passport, or photo ID issued by a branch or department of the state. Voters can obtain a Mississippi Voter Identification Card for free at any circuit clerk's office in Mississippi. If ID is not presented, the voter votes on a provisional ballot and must return within 5 days to show ID or sign an affidavit attesting to a religious objection to being photographed.

	When you arrive to vote at the polls on Election Day in Mississippi, you will need to present a valid form of ID. Acceptable forms of identification include a driver's license, state ID card, or a voter registration card with a photo. If you do not have an acceptable ID, you may vote using a provisional ballot and will need to provide ID to the election officials within five days for your vote to be counted.	
Doodling	Mississippi voters must request an absentee ballot by October 31, 2024, which is 15 days before Election Day. Voters must be eligible to vote absentee under state law. Absentee ballot requests can be made through the Mississippi Secretary of State's website or by contacting your local Circuit Clerk's office.	
Early Voting	Mississippi does not offer early voting for general elections. However, absentee voting provides a method for voters who cannot vote in person on Election Day due to specific reasons such as being out of the county or having health issues.
