Residency or Address Requirement	By law, your residence is that place at which you have established a home, where you are habitually present, and to which, when you depart, you intend to return. Can be a residence address or specific geographic location from which your residence address may be determined (can list the address of a shelter, a detailed description of where you usually park your car or where you are camping).
ID requirement	Voters must present a valid form of photo ID, a reasonable impediment certification, or vote provisionally. Voters can get a free state ID for voting purposes at the Nebraska DMV. They will need to bring documents confirming their identity and their address when applying for a state ID. More information can be found here: https://sos.nebraska.gov/elections/voter-id

In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	An election judge will request your identification and verify that it is an acceptable form of identification. Voters without ID may cast a provisional ballot. Persons casting Provisional Ballots may check to see if their ballot was counted. They can check seven business days after the election by visiting Votercheck or calling toll free 1-888-727-0007. Provisional Ballots are counted only if the information the voter provided on their certification forms was verified. The polls are open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. in the Central Time Zone and from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. in the Mountain Time Zone.	
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline	Request for an absentee ballot must be received 11 days before Election Day. Voted ballots are due by the close of polls on election day.	
All county election offices will accept early-voting applications up to 120 days prior to a state general election or special election. However, regular early-voting ballots are not sent out of least 35 days before a primary or general election and 15 days prior to all other elections. A ballots whether delivered in person or carrier to the county drop box or by mail must arrive of polls on the day of the election.
