Residency or Address Requirement	Voter must provide an address, and if the voter's name is not on the lease, they must provide verification that it is the voter's address. It can be the address of a shelter, post office, or service provider, but the voter must provide a note that confirms they will receive mail sent to that address. ID requirement	Driver's license, non-driver ID card issued by NH DMV or motor vehicle agency of another state, photo ID card for "voting identification only" issued by NH DMV, U.S. armed services identification card, U.S. passport or passcard, NH student ID card, photo ID not mentioned above, but determined to be legitimate. Voter Assistance or Accessibility	Each polling place is equipped with an accessible voting system to assist voters with a disability to independently and privately mark a ballot at every state election with a federal office on the ballot. A voter who needs assistance marking his or her ballot at the polling place may ask the moderator to authorize assistance from an election official or a person of the voter's choosing. In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	Available on Election Day, Tuesday, November 5, 2024. Polls are open from at least 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Voters that have not registered by election day can register to vote at their polling place. They'll need to show various forms of ID proving their name, age, citizenship status and where they live.
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline	If you qualify to vote absentee, you will need to complete an Absentee Ballot Application and return it to your local clerk. Requirements to be able to vote absentee can be found here: <a href="https://www.sos.nh.gov/elections/absentee-ballots">https://www.sos.nh.gov/elections/absentee-ballots</a> . Completed absentee ballots must be returned to your local clerk by mail or in person. <b>Deadline by mail:</b> 5:00 p.m. on election day. <b>Deadline in person:</b> By 5:00 p.m. the day before the election.
