Residency or Address Requirement	Residential address/shelter OR map/diagram of place of residence AND valid mailing address (does not need to match residence, PO Box may be rejected).
ID requirement	A physical form of identification is only required for first-time New Mexico voters who registered by mail and did not include identification with their voter registration application form. When registering for the first time in New Mexico, you must submit a copy of (1) a current and valid photo identification, OR (2) a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, student identification card or other government document. If you do not submit the required identification with your mailed-in, first time registration, then you will be required to present one of the forms of identification when voting in person or absentee. Otherwise, you will be asked to provide a verbal or written statement of identification including your name, year of birth, and registered address.

Voter Assistance or Accessibility	All polling locations are equipped with accessible voting equipment that is equipped for special accommodations for hearing, visual, physical, and other disabilities. Voters can select their choices using a touch screen, headphones, and other types of equipment available to assist voters in making their selections. The completed ballot is then fed into a tabulator, which scans and records the votes.

In-Person Voting: Tuesday November 5, 2024	You do not have to present identification to vote in a statewide election if you have presented identification for your registration. If you do not submit the required identification with your mailed-in, first time registration, then you will be required to present one of the forms of identification when voting in person or absentee.
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline	Voters may cast an absentee ballot or vote in person at their local County Clerk's office or an early voting location prior to Election Day. No excuse is required to vote with an absentee ballot. Request an absentee ballot by filling out an application and returning it to your local County Clerk. Early Voting	Expanded early voting is available in many counties beginning on the third Saturday before the election. Early voting ends the Saturday before the election.
