Residency or Address Requirement	It is recommended unhoused registrants list a shelter address as their voting address where they could receive mail. Alternatively, unhoused registrants may denote a street corner or a park as their residence, in lieu of a traditional home address.
ID requirement	Registered voters do not need to show ID to vote, unless they did not provide identification with their registration. First time voters must provide identification either on or with their voter registration application. If you have not provided ID by Election Day, you are still allowed to vote by affidavit ballot. Acceptable ID includes driver's license number, non-driver's ID number, last four digits of your social security number, current and Valid Photo ID, current Utility Bill, Bank Statement, Government Check or Paycheck, Government Document that shows Name and Address.

HOW TO VOTE IN NEW YORK

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<p>Voter Assistance or Accessibility</p>	<p>Any voter who requests assistance is entitled to receive it, regardless of the reason. Voters with a print disability, which means any disability that interferes with the effective reading, writing, or use of printed material, that require a ballot with accessible features may apply using the online Accessible Ballot Application portal. 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<p>In-Person Voting: Tuesday November 5, 2024</p>	<p>You do not have to present identification to vote if you have presented identification for your registration. If you do not submit the required identification with your first time registration, then you will have to option to vote by affidavit ballot.</p>
<p>Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline</p>	<p>Voters who qualify to vote by absentee ballot can request an absentee ballot by completing an application. Applications requesting to receive an absentee ballot by mail must be received by the board of elections in your county no later than ten days before the election. For absentee ballots to be received in-person, applications must be received by your board no later than the day before the election. <p>Early Voting</p>	<p>Applications requesting to receive an early mail ballot must be received by the board of elections in your county no later than ten days before the election. More info can be found on the link above.</p>
