

Residency or Add Requirement		No voter registration is required in North Dakota – anyone can vote with valid ID which requires an address.						
ID requirement		North Dakota requires voters to present identification while voting. Valid ID can be North Dakota driver's license, North Dakota Non-Driver's License, Tribal ID or Tribal Letter, or Long-Term Care Certificate. This machine will be provided for voters needing assistance, including those with disabilities and special needs. You can contact your county auditor to request to vote absentee using the Express Vote machine.

In-Person Voting: Tuesday November 5, 2024	Valid ID is required to vote in North Dakota. Valid ID can be North Dakota driver's license, North Dakota Non-Driver's License, Tribal ID or Tribal Letter, or Long-Term Care Certificate. If a voter does not have a form of identification that includes his or her current North Dakota residential address or date of birth, the voter can present accepted supplemental documents.		
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline	You can request an application for an absentee ballot. You must print, sign and deliver the absentee application to the appropriate election official. If you submit an application requesting an absentee ballot, you may receive and return your ballot by mail. Absentee ballots must be returned prior to Election Day to be counted.
