Residency or Address Requirement	Your residence is (1) the location that you consider to be a permanent, not a temporary, residence and (2) the place where your habitation is fixed and where, whenever you are absent, you intend to return. If you do not have a fixed place of habitation, but you are a consistent or regular inhabitant of a shelter or other location where you intend to return, you may use that location as your residence for the purposes of registering to vote.
ID requirement	There are several types of valid photo identification: Ohio driver's license; State of Ohio ID card; Interim ID form issued by the Ohio BMV; A US passport; A US passport card; US military ID card; Ohio National Guard ID card; or US Department of Veterans Affairs ID card All photo IDs must have the following: An expiration date that has not passed; A photograph of the voter; The voter's name, which must substantially conform to the voter's name as it appears in the Poll List or in the Poll Book

# HOW TO VOTE IN OHIO

Voter Assistance or Accessibility	In Ohio, every polling location is required to be accessible to ensure equal access for people with disabilities. Ohio voters with disabilities can also vote curbside, if they are physically unable to enter their polling location. If a voter cannot mark their ballot, or needs assistance because of a disability, the voter may bring someone to help, or ask for assistance from two poll workers from opposite major political parties.

In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	In person Voting in Ohio; November 5 (Polls Open 6:30 a.m. - 7:30 p.m.) If not returned by mail, absentee ballots must be received by your board of elections by 7:30 p.m
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline: Postmarked by October 7, 2024	The deadline to request an absentee ballot is seven days before the election in which you want to vote. If mailed, absentee ballots must be postmarked by the day before the election in order to be counted. You can also return your absentee ballot in person to your county board of elections ( <a href="https://www.ohiosos.gov/elections/elections-officials/county-boards-of-elections-directory/">https://www.ohiosos.gov/elections/elections-officials/county-boards-of-elections-directory/</a> ), before the close of the polls at 7:30 p.m. on Election Day.
