Residency or Address Requirement	Address OR a short description of a place of residence (legal description or directions), can be the address of a shelter, street corner, or park.
ID requirement	The law requires a document used for proof of identity for voting to contain the following information: the name of the person to whom it was issued, a photograph of the person to whom it was issued, an expiration date that is after the date of the election, unless the identification is valid indefinitely. If you do not have or if you refuse to show proof of identity, you may vote by provisional ballot and prove your identity by signing a sworn affidavit.

<p>Voter Assistance or Accessibility</p>	<p>Oklahoma voters who have visual or physical disabilities may vote independently and privately at their polling places on election day and during early voting at the County Election Board office preceding every election. Absentee voting is also a choice for voters with visual or physical disabilities.</p>

<p>In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024</p>	<p>Polls Open 7 a.m. - 7 p.m. If you do not have a valid ID, you have the right to request a provisional ballot. To receive a provisional ballot, you will need to sign a Provisional Ballot Affidavit and the Provisional Ballot Roster. After the election and before results are certified, the Secretary of the County Election Board will research your voter registration information. If your eligibility can be verified – your ballot will be counted.</p>
<p>Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline</p>	<p>The deadline to request an absentee ballot is 5:00 p.m., the third Monday (15 days) prior to an election. Voted ballots must be received by the County Election Board no later than 7:00 p.m. on election night. <p>Early Voting</p>	<p>You can vote early in your county at your designated early voting location from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on the Wednesday, Thursday and Friday preceding election day, in addition to 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. the Saturday preceding election day.</p>
