Residency or Address Requirement	Voters must provide a residence address on the voter registration form, but this address may be any definable location in the county that describes their physical location. This could be a shelter, park, motor home, or other identifiable location. The mailing address of a person who is unhoused or who resides where mail service is unavailable can be the office of the county clerk.
ID requirement	To register to vote online you will need an Oregon driver license, permit or ID card number issued by the Oregon Driver and Motor Vehicle Services Division (DMV). If you do not have an Oregon driver license, permit or ID card, you can still use the online voter registration application.

Voter Assistance or Accessibility	Oregon voters with a disability can use a screen reader or other assistive technology to access their ballot at home using Oregon's online ballot-marking tool. This option requires printing, signing and returning the ballot using the return envelope mailed by your county elections office approximately two weeks before an election. In-Person Voting	Oregon is a vote-by-mail state. Voters' pamphlets and ballots are mailed to active registered voters two to three weeks before each statewide election. Voters can return ballots by mail or at any official drop box across the state. Ballots must be mailed with a valid postmark by Election Day.
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline	Students attending an out-of-state college or voters traveling during an election can still receive a ballot.
