Residency or Address Requirement	Address OR map/diagram of place of residence. If you do not have a street name or address number, you can draw a diagram of the area in which you live on the map provided. Show your house in relation to local landmarks such as schools, churches, stores, etc. Be sure to label the streets or roads.
ID requirement	If registering to vote by mail or in person, provide a copy of any current, valid Photo ID, or a utility bill, bank statement, paycheck or government document showing your name and address in your county. If you do not have one, you may obtain a free Photo ID from your county voter registration and elections office or your local DMV office.

Voter Assistance or Accessibility	Voters with disabilities and voters who are blind or unable to read or write may receive assistance in voting. You must inform a poll manager if you require assistance. Voters who are unable to access the polling place or stand in line to vote due to a disability or being age 65 or older may vote in their vehicle. Voters with disabilities are qualified to vote absentee prior to election day.

In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	When voting in person, you will be asked to show one of the following current and valid Photo IDs: SC Driver's License, SC Department of Motor Vehicles ID Card, SC Voter Registration Card with Photo, Federal Military ID, or US Passport. If you can't get photo ID: Bring your non-photo voter registration card with you to the polling place. You may vote a provisional ballot after signing an affidavit stating you have a reasonable impediment to obtaining Photo ID.
Deadline	SC voters who meet the requirements to vote absentee must fill out an application and return it by mail or personal delivery to their county voter registration office by 5:00 p.m. on the 11th day prior to the election. Ballots must be received by the county voter registration office by 7:00 p.m. on election day. Must present photo ID when returning the absentee ballot. Early Voting	Monday, October 21 – Saturday, November 2. (Closed Sunday October 27.) Early voting centers are open 8:30 a.m 6:00 p.m. during the early voting period.
