Residency or Address Requirement	Address where you can receive mail (ex: agency, relative, etc.) AND a short description of your place of residence. Place of residence can be where one usually resides (park, street corner, etc.)
ID requirement	If you do not have a UT ID or UT Driver's License, you can provide the last 4 digits of your SSN when registering to vote. When voting, you will need to show TWO acceptable forms of ID: one that verifies identity AND one for proof of residence. If you are already registered to vote in Utah, you must have: ONE primary form of ID that is valid (not expired), has your name, and has your photograph. OR TWO forms of ID that, when combined, prove your name and current residence.

In-Person Registration Deadline	Available up to and on election day Tuesday, November 5, 2024
Mail-in Registration Deadline	Received by Friday, October 25, 2024
Online Registration Deadline	Friday, October 25, 2024

<p>Voter Assistance or Accessibility</p>	<p>Voters with disabilities can vote by mail, vote via email or fax, or vote at an early voting location. You may request an email or fax ballot through your county clerk's office. Your application must be received by your county clerk by Friday, October 25, 2024. <p>In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024</p>	<p>You will need to show TWO acceptable forms of ID: one that verifies identity AND one for proof of residence. If you are already registered to vote in Utah, you must have: ONE primary form of ID that is valid (not expired), has your name, and has your photograph. OR TWO forms of ID that, when combined, prove your name and current residence. More info: <a href="https://vote.utah.gov/voter-id-requirements/">https://vote.utah.gov/voter-id-requirements/</a> Voters who do not have photo ID while voting may cast <b>provisional ballots</b>. In that case, you must provide valid voter identification to the county clerk or an election officer who is administering the election by the close of normal office hours on Monday after the date of the election.</p>
<p>Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline: Postmarked by Monday, November 4, 2024</p>	<p>If you are an active registered voter, then you will automatically receive a ballot in the mail. Your mail ballot must be postmarked by the U.S. Post Office the day before Election Day, November 4, 2024. For individuals who need a ballot mailed to a location other than their registration address (absentee), an application must be received 11 days before Election Day. All completed forms should be mailed to your <b>county clerk's office</b>.</p>
<p>Early Voting</p>	<p>Early voting for the November 5, 2024 general election begins October 22nd and ends November 1st.</p>
