Residency or Address Requirement	Street address OR a description of place of residence that is the place you consider your principal dwelling place.
ID requirement	If you are registering to vote in Vermont for the first time by mail or online, you must include a photocopy of an acceptable form of ID. Acceptable forms of ID are: Valid photo ID (driver's license or passport), Current utility bill, Current bank statement, Another government document. Only first-time voters who registered by mail are required to present identification at the polls.

In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	Only first-time voters who registered by mail are required to present identification at the polls.
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline	Absentee ballots for the November 5, 2024, general election will be automatically mailed to all active registered voters, not later than October 1, 2024. All early voter absentee ballot requests must be submitted by 5 p.m. or by the close of the town clerk's office on the day before the election. All ballots must be returned to the town clerk's office before the close of the office on the day before the election, or to the polling place before 7 p.m. on the day of the election, in order to be counted.
Early Voting	Early or absentee voter ballots must be returned to the town clerk's office before the close of business on the day before the election (be sure to check your town clerk's hours) or to the polling place by 7 p.m. on Election Day.
