Residency or Address Requirement	A citizen can provide an alternative description of their residence, even if they are experiencing homelessness, as long as it enables the authorities to identify and assign a voting precinct to them. The mailing address on their registration form can be a P.O. box, local shelter, advocacy organization, outreach center, or the home of someone who will accept mail for them.
ID requirement	To register, you must provide a WV driver's license or ID or card number and SSN. If you do not have those, you may not submit your form online, but you may enter your information online to be auto-filled in a voter registration application. Once you create your application online, you may print, sign and deliver it to your County Clerk by mail or in person. You are required to present photo ID at the polls, but you may obtain a voter ID card for free from your county clerk's office.

Voter Assistance or Accessibility	All polling places in West Virginia are equipped with at least one ADA approved Voting Machine. Voters with physical disabilities who cannot vote in person may apply to vote absentee by mail. Voters who cannot vote in person and cannot mark their ballot without assistance due to a physical disability may vote electronically.

In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	Required to present ID at the polls. Acceptable forms of identification include government-issued IDs (both those with and without photographs), bank cards, bank statements, and insurance cards. The voter may also be identified by a poll worker or other adult they have known for at least six months. Voters can obtain a free voter ID card at their county clerk's office. Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline: Received or Postmarked November 5, 2024	Eligible voters can vote absentee. The absentee ballot application must be received in your county clerk's office by the 6th day before each election. Applications may be submitted to your county clerk via fax, U.S. mail, email, or in-person by hand delivery. For hand-delivery, absentee ballots must be delivered to the County Clerk's office by the day before Election Day. Mailed ballots must be postmarked by general Election Day and received by 5 days after general Election Day
Early Voting	Begins October 23rd and ends November 2nd.
