Residency or Address Requirement	Must verify residency in Wisconsin, but unhoused residents can provide the location where one usually stays at such as a park, shelter, street corner, etc.
ID requirement	Voters present photo identification at the polls. Accepted forms of ID can be found at https://elections.wi.gov/acceptable-photo-ids . One can obtain a free photo ID from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation. Without photo ID, one may cast a provisional ballot but must present your photo ID to the municipal clerk in person by 4:00 p.m. the Friday after the election.

Mail-in Registration Deadline	Postmarked by Wednesday, October 16, 2024
Online Registration Deadline	Wednesday, October 16, 2024

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In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024	If you do not have a photo ID, you are allowed to vote by provisional ballot. You can bring your photo ID to the polling place by 8:00 p.m. You may also present your photo ID to the municipal clerk in person by 4:00 p.m. the Friday after the Election. If you provide photo ID by the deadline, the ballot will count. If you do not provide photo ID by the deadline, your ballot will not count.
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline: Postmarked by October 16, 2024	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• You can request an absentee ballot on myvote.wi.gov or make a request to your municipal clerk in writing, electronically, or in person (starting 14 days before the election) using the Application for Absentee Ballot or statement containing all the information required on the form.• Military and Overseas electors may also use the Federal Postcard Application (FPCA), which is a combination registration form and absentee ballot request.
