Residency or Address Requirement	Must verify residency in Wisconsin, but unhoused residents can provide the location where one usually stays at such as a park, shelter, street corner, etc.

One can obtain a free photo ID from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation. Without photo ID, one may cast a provisional ballot but must present your photo ID to the municipal clerk in person by 4:00 p.m. the Friday after the election.
