Residency or Address Requirement	Mailing address must provide address where you can receive mail (ex: shelter, service provider, relative, etc.), but description of place of residence can be where you usually reside (park, street corner, etc.)
ID requirement	If the voter does not possess an acceptable photo ID and cannot reasonably obtain one, the voter can provide a copy of an original of a government document that shows the voter's name and an address. After showing alternative ID document, the voter must execute a Reasonable Impediment Declaration.

Mail-in Registration Deadline	Postmarked by Sunday, October 6, 2024
Online Registration Deadline	n/a

<p>In-Person Voting: Tuesday, November 5, 2024</p>	<p>Under Texas law, voters who possess one of the seven acceptable forms of photo ID must present that ID at the polls when voting in person. Voters who do not possess and cannot reasonably obtain one of the seven approved forms of photo ID may fill out a Reasonable Impediment Declaration (RID) (PDF) at the polls and present an alternative form of ID, such as a utility bill, bank statement, government check, or a voter registration certificate.</p>
<p>Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline: October 26th, 2024</p>	<p>Call your local or county office holding the election and request that an application to vote by mail be sent to you, or download the application here (PDF). To vote by mail, you must provide ONE of the following numbers on your ABBM: (1) Texas Driver's License, Texas Personal Identification Number or Election Identification Certificate Number issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (NOT your voter registration VUID number); OR (2) If you have not been issued one of the numbers above, the last 4 digits of your Social Security Number. If you have not been issued a Texas Driver's License, Texas Personal Identification Number or Texas Election Identification Certificate Number or a Social Security Number, you must indicate so by checking the appropriate box on the ABBM.</p>
